FELIX EDWARD REPETTO, born in New Jersey as an escort to a twin sister, you took up engineering as your profession and rose from a boiler room foreman to an executive of the Pocahontas Steamship Company. During World War II, you served ably as a consultant to all our armed forces in the Solid Fuels Administration for War. It was during the Great Depression of the 1930's that you first came to know West Virginia and her people, and you first became acquainted with this College in no uncertain terms when your boss, the late Oakey Logan Alexander, ordered you to secure the weekend football scores and you failed to include Concord, his Alma Mater.
